How many beds do you have in your house?

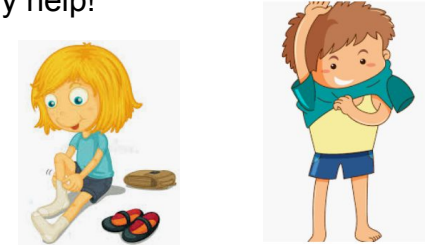
Try counting with Teddy:

Practise getting your clothes on and off without any help!

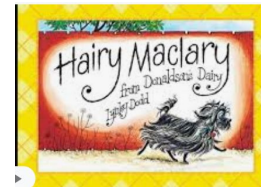


All the dogs in the story this week are different sizes. Can you order some of your toys from the biggest to the smallest?
